Transdermal Rotigotine (Neupro)

A patch formulation of the non-ergot dopamine agonist rotigotine (*Neupro* – UCB) has returned to the US market after a 4-year absence. Originally approved by the FDA in 2007 for treatment of early Parkinson's disease,¹ it was withdrawn in 2008 because of crystallization of the drug in the patch, which could have led to under-dosing. The new patch has somewhat broader indications than the old one; it is approved for use in any stage of Parkinson's disease (PD) and also for moderate-to-severe restless legs syndrome (RLS).
